
- "... Australian slang for a rumour, or an erroneous or improbable story ..."
- The word is derived from water carts made by a company established by John Furphy (J. Furphy & Sons, Shepparton, Vic). Many Furphy water carts were used to take water to Australian Army personnel during World War I. The carts, with "J. Furphy & Sons" written on their tanks, became popular as gathering places where soldiers could exchange gossip, rumours and fanciful tales—much like today's water cooler discussion.
- "Another suggested explanation is that the rumbling of an approaching water cart sounded like the firing of artillery, thus causing a false alarm."















## Some GEMs (or furphies?) ... GEMs Different "markets" • share markets — equities (stocks) · commodities markets · currency markets derivatives — futures contracts, options, CFDs, warrants, etc. . . . There are many variations to the whole "market". Some GEMs (or furphies?) ... GEMs Behaviour · can be unpredictable • often moves slowly, but can move very fast An elephant is like this. The share market can be docile at times, and then it can move a long way very quickly. When the market falls, it can fall heavily and quickly (down by the elevator). GEMs Some GEMs (or furphies?) ... Get up close It's okay to look at a very small portion of the market or a price chart (like close-up on an elephant); But also useful to step back and view bigger picture . . .

# Some GEMs (or furphies?) ... Step back — bigger picture • In the market for individual stocks or instruments, step back to look at longer time periods (using daily, weekly, or monthly charts) You might spot a different trend, or significant chart pattern • Also take a look at the performance and behaviour of the overall market index (XJO or XAO in Australia), or the relevant sub-indexes Remember: "A rising tide lifts all boats!" (Doesn't it?).





## Brainy's GEMs Blue Chip? "Show me a list of Blue Chip stocks — they will make me money! — Won't they?" Many long-term investors buy blue chip stocks for the bottom drawer . . . A useful long-term strategy?? What do you think?

Current definition\*:


Larger companies with a long history of profitability and stability.

Former definition\*:

Shares, usually highly valued, in a major company known for its ability to make profits in good times or in bad, and with reduced risk of default.


- It depends on your strategy and objective:

  - Total Shareholder Return? (ie. share gain + dividend)




During the GFC, most Aussie blue chip stocks fell in value, and some fell by 50%!

## Some GEMs (or furphies?) ... Sell in May and go away The months of May to October are renowned for poor returns on the global share markets and the months of October to December often have good returns Partly explained by the northern hemisphere "summer vacation" — much of Europe goes into holiday mode for a few weeks in July-August, and likewise in North America.

# Some GEMs (or furphies?) ... Self-fulfilling prophecy? Something to ponder over dinner: Is it possible that with so many people following technical analysis principles that many of the concepts are actually self-fulfilling? For example: Price approaching an obvious support or resistance level. A chart pattern (eg. triangle) suggesting continuation. etc.



# Brainy's GEMS How old is Technical Analysis? 1980s-1990s — chart indicators on computers Early 20th century — Ralph Elliott, William Gann, etc. 1948 — Edwards and Magee published "Technical Analysis of Stock Trends" 1920s and 1930s — Richard W. Schabacker published several books (continued over.../)

How old is Technical Analysis?

- Charles Dow (1851-1902) developed a series of principles for understanding and analysing market behaviour which later became known as Dow theory
- Early 18th century —
   Candlesticks developed and used in Japan;
   Munehisa Homma the father of candles
- 17th century it is said that Joseph de la Vega hinted at the notions of technical analysis in his writings about the Dutch market.
